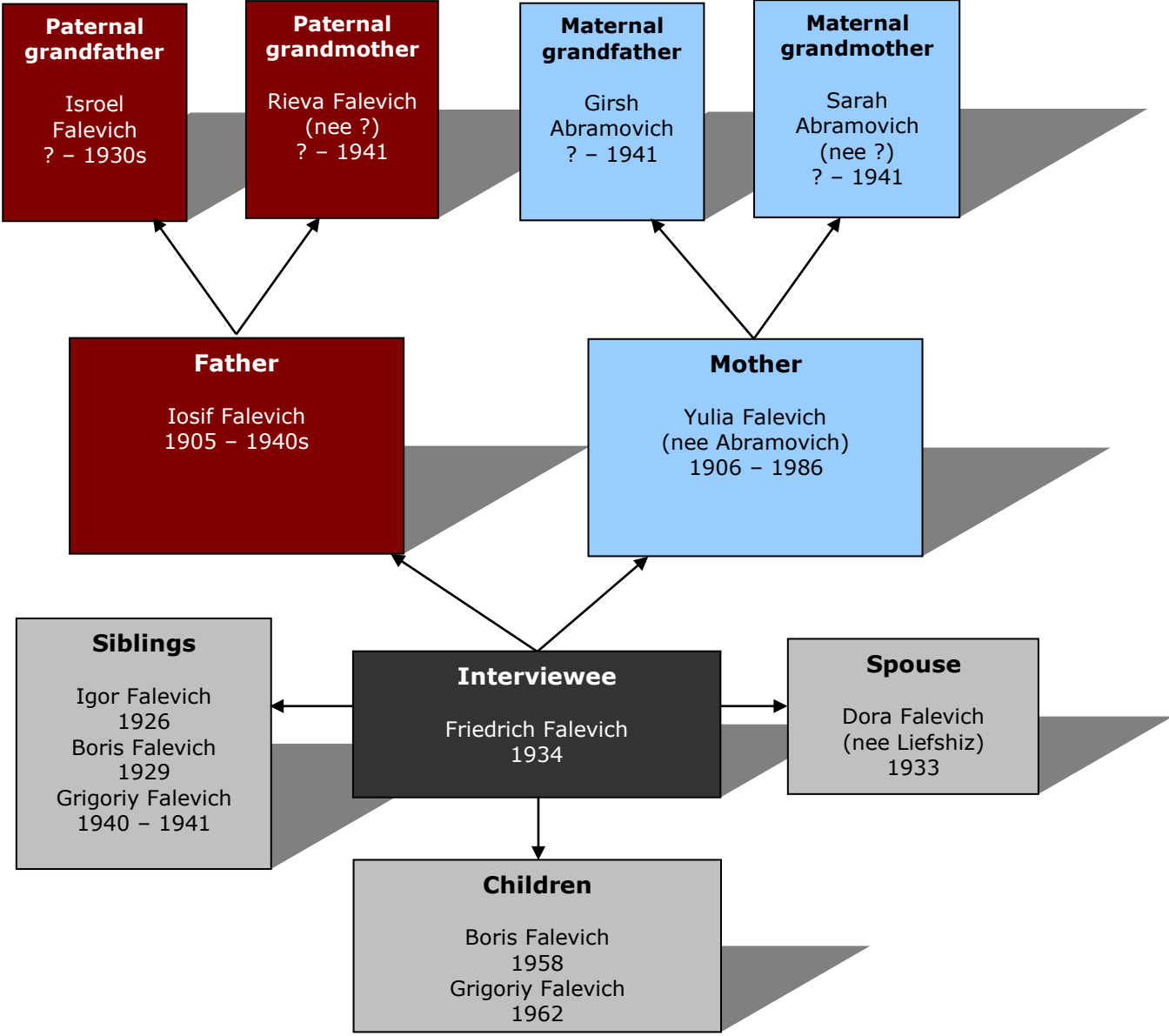


Family Tree

My parents were atheists. They did not observe Jewish traditions. My father was a member of the Party and raised us, his sons, to be patriots of the USSR

What is your mother tongue?

Russian

What other languages do you speak?

Yiddish, Belarusian, German

1954 – 1957: fixed service in the Soviet army, Thermez settlement (today Uzbekistan)

Where were you during the Holocaust?

Ghetto in Slutsk, a partisan family camp, stayed hiding in some Belarusian villages. Returned to Slutsk after the liberation of the town in July 1944.

What did you do after the Holocaust?

Lived in Slutsk, after finishing school studied in the Minsk College of Finance and Economics, and then served in the army for a fixed term. After finishing my studies I lived in Slutsk, worked and studied in the Agricultural Academy.
