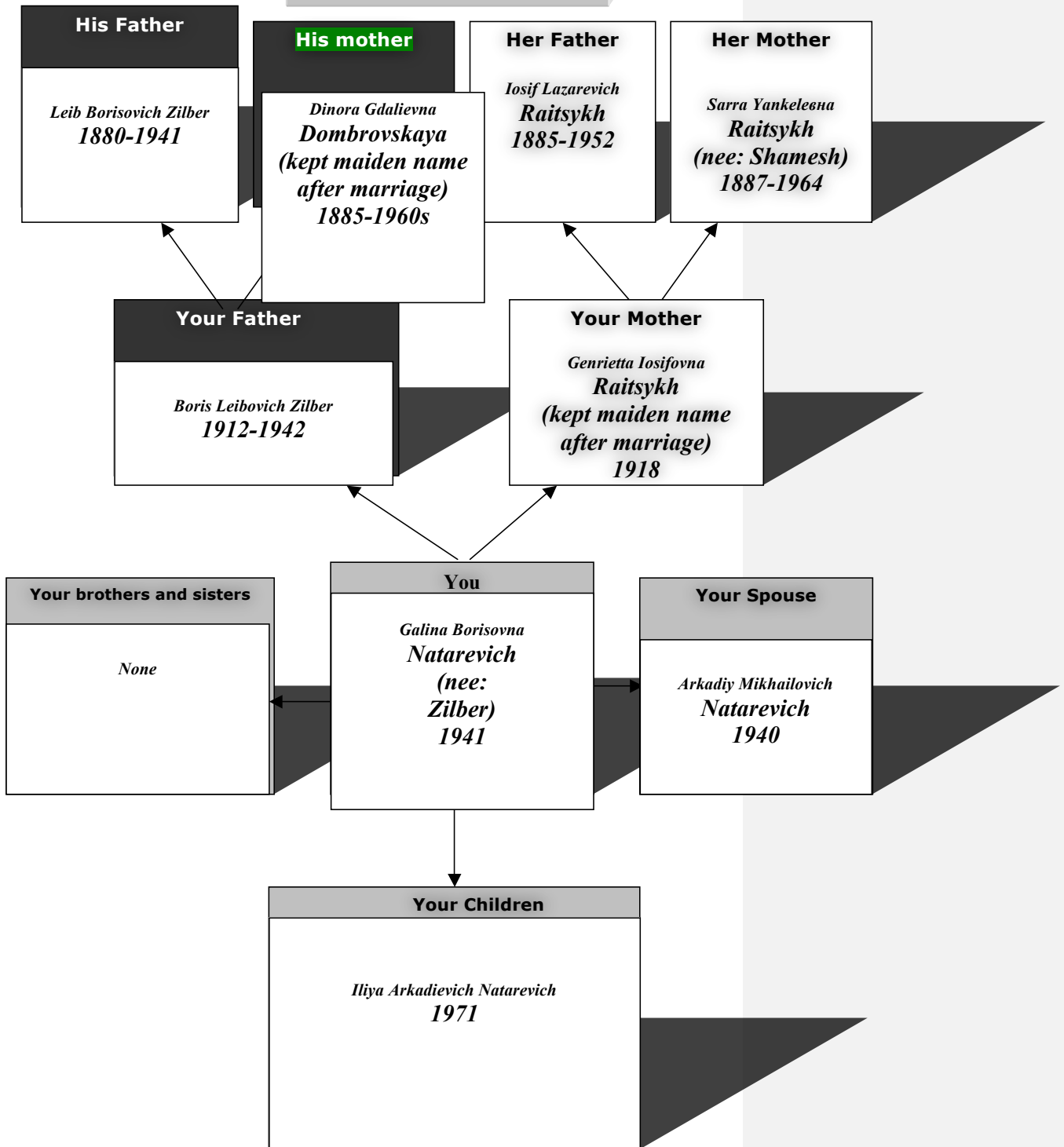

1969-1991: Industrial complex of decorative and applied arts, Leningrad.

What was the level of religiosity in your parents' home? How were you raised?

Until 1952, before Grandfather Iosif Lazarevich died, we observed all Jewish traditions: prohibition to eat pork, various customs, etc.

Compared to other Leningrad families, we were raised in decent conditions in the years following the war. We regularly attended to the performances of Opera and Ballet theater after S.Kirov. Representatives of artistic circles have often visited our home. Repasts and discussions were quite usual.

1939-1959: solo ballet dancer of Opera and Ballet Theatre after S.Kirov

1960-1962: Leningrad ballet on ice;

What was her level of religiosity?

Non-religious, but observed common Jewish traditions like kashrut and
celebrated Jewish holidays, but not always

What was her mother tongue?

Russian

Evacuated to Molotov (now Perm)

Returned with her theatre to Leningrad

1908-1914: Munich University, medical faculty

What sort of work did he do?

1917-1920: Medical doctor, the Administration of Fishing Industry, Baku;

1920-1935: Medical doctor, out-patients' clinic, Baku;

1935-1941: Sanitary medical doctor, Leningrad;

What was his level of religiosity?

Very religious, observed all Jewish traditions, prayed regularly

What was his mother tongue?

Yiddish

1914-1917: medical military service in the Hospital of Prince Oldenburgsky,
Petrograd;
