

Miron Golberg (Mote Maron): 1898-1973. Specialist in timber marking and timber rafting. Director of a timber cutting factory; married three times, four children; lived in Chechersk, died in Gomel.

Zalman: date of birth unknown, perished in the Holocaust in 1942 along with his wife and 2 children in the city of Cherven.

Anna (Yanka): 1902-1974. Housewife, husband was a public prosecutor; one son died at the front, the second lives in St. Petersburg.

Evsei: 1905-1992. Teacher; director of a boarding school for difficult youth in the Minsk region; director of a secondary school in Kazan; five children.

Evdokiya: 1912-1976. Head of the storehouse of the expedition to the North Pole in Leningrad; didn't marry.

Alexander: 1912-1957. Economist, professor at the Leningrad Polytechnical Institute (LPI) lector- internationalist.

Where was he during the Holocaust?
