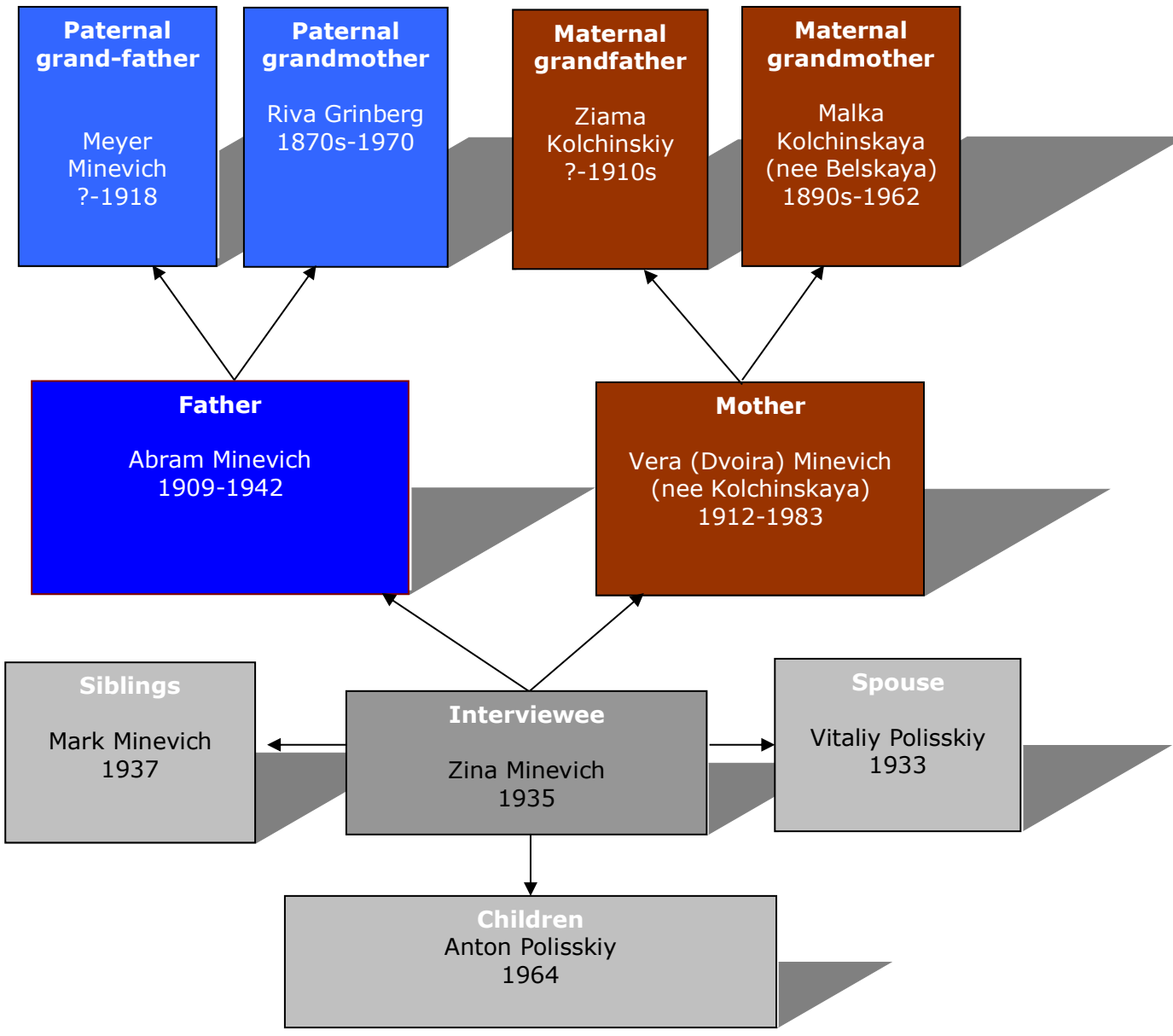

David Stoliarov – born in 1902, military doctor, died in Moscow in 1967. His daughter lives in Germany.

Isaac Minevich - born in Penizevichi in 1907, was at the front from 1941 till

1946, afterwards was deputy director of "Glavbumsbyt". 3 children: Mark (1930), Dania (1935) and Irina (1939). His wife and children live in the US. He died in 1983.

Clara Minevich born in 1900, born in Penizevichi, from 1941 lived in Tashkent. Died in 1970s.

Zina Minevich born in 1898, born in Penizevichi, in 1925 left for Argentina with her husband. Died in Buenos Aires in 1967.
